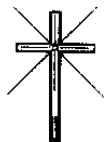

## Chaplain's Message by Rev. James Starasinich

Dear Brother Knights,

We shall celebrate the Paschal Triduum this month at the conclusion of Lent. It begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. The movement of these three days can be somewhat confusing if we do not take the time to review and ponder the meaning of the Sacred Triduum. It is three days, beginning with Thursday evening, and concluding with the Paschal Vigil on Saturday night. There is a respectful silence as we meditate on the Passion of our Lord, who began that Passion in the Garden of Gethsemane after he departed the place where He shared the meal with the twelve apostles. We repose the Blessed Sacrament in another location, adoring until midnight. We leave the church in silence. We gather in silence on Friday for the celebration of the Lord's Passion. We venerate the Cross, recalling also our own cross that we ask the Good Lord to help us embrace and carry so that we may be worthy to be called His disciples. Do not be afraid to take up your cross at Jesus' command as He carries it with us. We do everything in Christianity with Jesus' help. He welcomed Simon of Cyrene to help Him carry the Cross. Let us welcome Jesus to help us carry our crosses. We leave again the church in silence. We gather silently again and prepare to celebrate the Feast of all Feasts, beginning with the Lucernarium, or the Liturgy of the Light, done outside the church building (weather permitting).

The Exultet is sung and the Light overcomes the darkness, for our victory is at hand. Then the Liturgy of the Word is celebrated in abundance, recalling salvation history and we again sing the Gloria, while we ring the bells that fell silent at the conclusion of the Gloria during the Mass of the Lord's Supper. A festive Alleluia is sung, introducing the Gospel that proclaims the Resurrection. It is a night when catechumens receive full initiation into the Body of Christ, the Church.

Christ is Risen! He is truly Risen! That becomes our joyful acclamation as we begin the Octave, the eight days of Easter which is really one great day celebrated because Christ our Passover is Risen for us! Divine Mercy Sunday, instituted by Pope St. John Paul II, concludes the Octave, recalling Christ's gift of Mercy to the world. That mercy is a gift freely given. Let us pray that many will open their hearts to Christ's invitation: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened and I will restore you." Prepare well for the wedding feast of "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." The Love and Mercy of God is the message we are all called to live as Christians. May the Good Lord complete the good work he has begun in us!

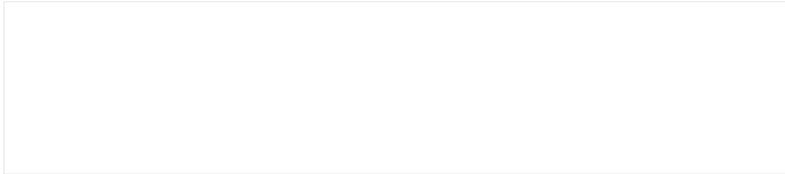
